

B. 'Palomar Prince' is a Mike Kartuz hybrid that has been described in simile "like a starburst on a clear winter night's sky since it strikes a royal presence." This rhizomatous begonia has large green leaves that are double-spiraled with maroon markings. It is now a medium sized compact plant that Rainee Freeman purchased from the begonia booth during the Zilker Garden Festival. It is protected from the freeze since it is indoors near a south window. She sent the two pictures of this almost year-old begonia that is now in bloom.

In the Begonia Leaflet B. 'Brad Thompson' is a new hybrid with leaf coloration that Brad himself got from his cross between B. 'Angel Glow' by Ross Bolwell from Australia and B. 'Palomar Prince.'

The November meeting was canceled due to ice and snow.

Lynn Sissney presented a detailed financial report for all members showing the share account, classic business checking, and money market account with a total of \$3707.48.

**Lynn** made a motion to have named begonias in the Greene Room if the club is asked to provide an educational display for the Zilker Garden Festival. The motion passed.

Zilker Garden Festival Tickets have been purchased and will be distributed in February.

The meeting adjourned for the program presented by Lynn Sissney, who decorated a wooden piece of driftwood. Ken Fuchs provided the pictures as Lynn added charcoal to the potting mix and the water glass to sweeten the mixture. Then she added nylon string that would water the plants. She started with B. 'Dottie's Eyelashes,' added Creeping Jenny to drape over the front edge of the driftwood before added plants with color. To gain height she placed B. 'Sultan.' Last of all, she added sphagnum moss over the roots. She keeps these beautiful creations under a table, weather permitting, and mists the plants to keep them growing.



For pruning and cutting for quick growth:

March 5, 6, and 7 Taurus

March 20 and 21 Capricorn.

### IN MEMORIAM

Clarice Mathis James, who was born January 28, 1920, in Temple, was a charter member of the Iris Society of Austin, the first president of the Austin Area Begonia Society, the founding member of the begonia society, an artist who worked in Porcelain Arts, Day Care Director of the Lower Colorado Lakes Girl Scout Council, president of the Austin Kennel Club, and officer and volunteer for the Austin Area Garden Council. She also was instrumental in reviving Columbus Fancy Canaries.

When she moved to Corsicana, Walter Anderson James moved next door and the two married August 11, 1941 in Ennis and moved to Austin. She retired from the Internal Revenue Service after working for them for 19 years. Walter died August 29, 1992, and Clarice joined him Friday, January 10, 2014. She lived in a care center in Bastrop to be near her daughter, Kathey Hatcher of McDade. Her funeral was held at 1 P.M. Tuesday, January 14.
