
# President's Message by Dan Cathey

Welcome to 2020! I want to wish everyone a sincere (although belated) Merry Christmas and Happy New Year and to hope for your best iris season ever.

We have not had to address the need for new Club officers in quite a while but changing circumstances dictate an almost complete change in our leadership. These elections are extremely important since they will help to set the Society's direction and success in the upcoming year(s). Club by-laws specify that elections are to proceed as follows: January - nominations for all officers presented at the meeting, March - vote on the proposed slate of officers be elected by a majority vote of the membership present, and May - installation of officers with the new officers taking over their positions at the September meeting.

In November, we had some lengthy discussions on the need for members to step up and volunteer for various positions and the result of these conversations yielded these unofficial offerings: President -Mitchell Whitley to replace Dan Cathey, V.P. The nomination committee consists of Mitchell Whitley and Michael Lowe who are to present the official nominations at this meeting and call for nominations from the floor. The position of Show Chair is an appointed position and will be filled by Ken Anderson and Linda Roper as co-chairs for this year's Spring Show. Next year's Show Chair will be selected after the 2020 Show (let me stress now that without a Show Chair we cannot have a Show).


