LOOKING BACK

As our 2020-2021 club year comes to a close, we can start looking forward to our 63rd year as the Waco Iris Society. During the pandemic of 2020, we were fortunate to have only had to cancel one meeting and, of course, our show, which was a big disappointment. Many clubs in our Region are still unable to meet because their meeting venues are still not open for such things. As a result of Covid-19, we were not able to get guest speakers. AIS canceled the 2020 **100 Year Celebration of AIS** convention in New Jersey, so we missed our usual November video tour of the year's convention our webmaster, Ken Fuchs usually has for us. Most of the year's programs consisted of interesting webinar programs provided by the American Iris Society.

We had a great sale in September and a sell-out at the show. We were short on show sale plants because of the February deep freeze that severely damaged or killed many of the irises potted up for the Sale last fall.

This past year, we mourned the passing of Hazel Haik. Hazel was a member of the Waco Iris Society, where she served five terms as club president. She was a member of WIS and the American Iris Society for nearly 50 years. She was a Master Exhibition and Garden Judge for AIS, a rank awarded judges after

15 years of judging.

LOOKING FORWARD

May 15th will be our final meeting of the 2020-2021 club year and at our usual venue—Crestview Church of Christ Community Center, 7129 Delhi. We will discuss our April show—one of our largest in a while. Show Chair, Ken Anderson, will present the many show awards to the winners. The new 2021-2022 club year will kick off on September 18th with our annual Iris Giveaway and Auction. Per our By-Laws, all members who have attended three (3) meetings during the past club year and who participated in the club sale or show are eligible to receive a free iris purchased by the club. meeting is eligible for a free iris. There will also be an auction of all the irises not chosen in the giveaway. Everyone, including guests and new members, is encouraged to participate in the auction.

September 25th will be our big Iris Sale at GreenLife Nursery. The annual Sale is where members bring increases of their favorite irises and offer them for sale at discount prices. The September Sale is our club's annual fundraiser, generating the money to host our annual Iris Show and pay for irises for the September Giveaway and Auction. We get to meet new friends and welcome back long-time customers. The Sale is an event anticipated by many residents of Waco and surrounding areas. March 20, 2021 Meeting Minutes by Ken Anderson

It is wonderful to write this article regarding the outcome of the 2021 Waco Iris Society Show. As we all can recall, we could not have the show last year because of Covid-19. This year there was still some concern about hosting an event during this pandemic, but as more and more people were receiving their vaccinations, it was no longer a reason to cancel our show. But then came the winter storm, the likes of which I have never seen. I believe every club member suffered the loss of many of their irises, and everyone wondered if we would even be able to have enough blooms to stage a show. As the time grew near, members were encouraged to bring whatever they could. Despite the extremely cold weather in February, we ended up having a really great show. We had twelve exhibitors with a total of 135 entries. We had more people showing irises this year than any that I can remember for several years. We also had more entries than we have had in several years. There were only eight dupli-

cations, so we ended up having 127 different cultivars entered. This was a tremendous response in spite of all the bad weather. I want to thank all of you who brought entries. You were a big part of making the show a success. The assistance provided by all the other members is greatly appreciated, too.

Linda Barnard won the Best Specimen of Show. She won with her entry of “Let’s Play Dress Up” (Paul Black, 2017). Looking back at previous lists of entries, I believe this is the first time Linda has entered the horticultural division. She brought only two entries, but what a fantastic way to start!

The winner of the Silver Medal, the exhibitor with the most blue ribbons, was Mary Keeth. She had a total of 23 blue ribbons. The winner of the Bronze Medal, the exhibitor with the second-highest blue ribbons, was Michael Lowe. He had a total of 13 blue ribbons.

In the Artistic Division, there were three exhibitors. Ken Anderson, Peggy Cathey, and Linda Roper each had two entries. Congratulations to Linda. Before this show, she was still eligible for the Novice category as she had not yet won a blue ribbon. However, she created a beautiful design entitled “Tribute to the Horned Toad,” winning Best Design of Show.
