# NELDA'S COCONUT CAKE

1 box of Duncan Hines white cake mix 14 ounce package of coconut 1 can of Goyas Cream of Coconut 1 (8 oz.) tub of Cool Whip 1 teaspoon of vanilla

- 1. Follow directions for preparing the cake mix with the egg whites, water, and Crisco oil.
- 2. Mix together and add about ½ package of coconut to the batter.
- Bake in a (13" x9" x 2") Pyrex at 350 degrees for 30-35 minutes. Cake is done when it springs back when touched and also pulls away from sides of baking dish.
- 4. With a fork punch holes in the cake while it is still warm. Pour the Cream of Coconut over the cake and let it cool.
- 5. Ice the cake with a mixture of 8 ounces of Cool Whip, one teaspoon of vanilla, and 7 ounces or less of the coconut. Sprinkle some coconut on top of the frosting.
- 6. Refrigerate the cake.

## **COUNCIL NOTES**


Members signed the paper provided by the Bonsai Society to accept the exhibit in the Zilker Botanical Garden.


Christmas Trees will be decorated by clubs November 19 from 10-2:30.
