Begonia convolvulacae



Begonia convolvulacae is a trailing begonia that has big glossy lobed foliage with pendant flowers in late winter when it is growing in a hanging basket or climbing on a tree or post. It is known as the grape leaf begonia as well as morning glory begonia. Other names are *B. rugosa*, *B. schottiana*, and *B. unialata*.

SWR/ABS COMES TO AUSTIN in May 2019

The Southwest Region/American Begonia Society Get Together in Austin May 1-5 offers even more speakers, events, and tours for an exciting event in this capital city of Texas, known for its music, the Lyndon Baines Johnson Library, the O'Henry Museum(William Sydney Porter), Zilker Botanical Garden Conservancy, French Legation, and the Texas State Cemetery that has the shortest road in the state.

The Judging School on Wednesday will be an all-day learning experience beginning at 9:30 A.M. and ending at 4:30 P.M. With the new skills and information gained a student will be able to judge the show plants that will be entered from 5 P.M. until 7 P.M. on Thursday.

Also on Thursday a tour will be offered to 4801 La Crosse Avenue, the home of the National Wildflower Research Center better known as the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center. It was established in 1982 by Lady Bird Johnson (Mrs. Lyndon Baines Johnson) and Actress Helen Hayes in East Austin before it moved to its present location. Then the group will drive to Dripping Springs to Miller's Tropicals, where the greenhouse usually has some begonias among the rare tropical plants and extraordinary orchids.

Another tour will be offered on Saturday for the 42nd Annual Pecan Street Festival — arts, crafts, and music providing the diverse sights, sounds, and tastes of Austin.



Early Friday morning Stephen Maciejewski will provide arm chair travelers with a trip to the wilds of China to find new gesneriads and begonias. He is president of the DVB/ ABS and Philadelphia Liberty Bell Gesneriad Society Chapter and co-chair of the GS Student Convention Grant Committee. He has searched

for gesneriads and begonias in Ecuador, China, Vietnam, Indonesia, Fiji, and Cuba.

At 9:15 A.M. a tour through the Fort Worth Botanic Garden Begonia Species Collection will be given by Taddie Hamilton and other volunteers who will show the terrarium collection and report on improvements and new species in their largest collection in North America.





At 10:30 A.M. Dr. Rekha Morris. author and collector from South Carolina, will enthusiastically tell attendees about begonia species from Mexico and Costa Rica. Her excellent photography will enable visitors to be


