Happenings on Iris Hill

Burr!!! I do believe old man winter is here and he plans on staying awhile. I knew deep down that those sunny 70 degree days recently were just a tease before it turned cold and icy. Well, fear not as this is the time to bring out all the gardening catalogs that have been coming in the mail and plan for the future. One of the good things about cold weather (if there is such a thing) is that I now have time to actually read those gardening books and catalogs that I have been collecting all year. There is a reason for everything and winter is the time to take a break and kick back. To sit in front of a nice fire with a cup of hot tea and a stack of gardening material and start planning for the future is a perfect wintertime activity. Throw a couple of football games and the new series of Downton Abby and it will make the dark, cold days of winter better.

And since the calendar says it is February, my thoughts always turn to roses. No, not the kind you get for Valentine's Day, however I would never turn those down, but the bare-root plants that I ordered months ago. Of course, they always seem to show up on my door step during the coldest day of the year. You know you are a gardener when you are out in the garden in February planting rose bushes when the temperatures are hovering around freezing. Through the years, however, I have learned that you can keep the bare-root roses in a cool place just fine until a nice sunny day. That is why a gardener is always learning. Don't forget this is the time of year to also prune your roses. Even the antique roses will appreciate a little trim now. And don't forget to plan a regular feeding schedule for your roses. They are heavy feeders and need the right nutrition to produce those wonderful blooms. After all my years of growing roses, I have developed my own plan for feeding roses and with what materials and I can say it makes a difference. If you would like a copy of my rose feeding schedule, let me know and I will send you a copy.

With more and more being written about alternative medicines to keep us healthy, people are becoming more aware of the fact that Vitamin C helps prevent colds. Now, there are several good sources of Vitamin C in everyday fruits and vegetables, but why not try something different. This winter, to ward off those winter colds, try using rose hips to get your daily requirement of Vitamin C. By drinking several cups of Rose Hip Tea each day, you will get your recommended dose of Vitamin C. Make sure your hips come from organically grown roses and add a little honey for added benefits and sweetness.

Rose Hip Tea

1 tsp. dried rose hips (Rubrifolia or Rosa Rugosa have the biggest ones but any variety will work)

For each cup of tea, put 1 teaspoon of dried rose hips into a teapot.

Add very hot water (not boiling, to preserve the Vitamin C)

and allow to stand several minutes, covering the teapot with a cozy or thick towel.

Enjoy!

Also, this is the time of year that a gardener needs to walk around their yard and look at the structure. This is a good opportunity to think about adding a walkway, a retaining wall or a great piece of garden art. It is much easier to visualize these now. Of course don't forget to look for those first small signs of spring peeking their heads out of the ground. I know when I start seeing the first daffodils or crocus blooming, spring cannot be far behind. If you have not planted bulbs in the past, make a note to plant some this fall and you will be rewarded next spring. So, until next time, happy gardening.
