

2015 ISA SHOW — THINGS TO CONSIDER:

The English Box

English Boxes are a part of Exhibition Judging in the Horticultural Division to display collections of single irises without stems, buds, or foliage in an iris show. This box is viewed from above showing 5 and not more than 6 individual flowers of the same classification such as all Spuria, all SDB, or all Tall Bearded. Each iris should be correctly named with the label or a 3 X 5 card posted outside the box, the names of the irises being on the card in their correct positions as displayed in tiny jars filled with sand underneath the 18" X 24" box that is 4 inches from the table to the top.

The blossoms should be uniform in size, form, substance, and texture. They should appear to float above the box with no falls touching the surface of the box. Bicolors can be combined with two self colors, but color clash and poor color arrangement will be faulted by the judges.

Even the background covering should be non-reflective and neutral in color so that it does not clash with the flower colors.

The Artistic Division

When completing an artistic arrangement for the Iris Show, the designer must remember that one or more iris blooms must be the center of interest. For this show the designer has several choices for the competition since small designs will be accepted.

Although the exhibitor does not have to grow the flowers or plant material, he should be the person who has created the design. The plant material must be fresh, not treated or dried. The material or any part of the plant on the state conservation list is strictly prohibited. The use of colors or bunting is permitted if it interprets the theme. American flag or any international flags can not be used, but accessories are permitted.

The show committee will provide a sign indicating that the exhibits will be protected, but they can not be responsible for loss or damage to the exhibitor's property.

The Educational Division

Shelia Senghas is the only person

who will complete an educational display, but other members are encourage to find a topic and enter by calling 512-327-0401.

TOPICS TO CONSIDER

- Show how to divide and transplant iris.
- Tell how to arrange flowers for a specific design.
- Give step by step instructions for hybridizing iris
- Draw a landscape using irises.
- Tell about iris diseases or pests and how to treat to prevent this from happening again.
- In the American Iris Society Bulletin articles showed before and after treatment for nut grass and how the chemical had affected the irises. What have you used?
- Show examples of newsletters that Iris Society of Austin has done. What has the Iris Society done for you?
- Tell about the difference in a crop of irises with foliage cut too short instead of leaving at least 5 inches of leaves in a fan shape when planting.

DAVID KRAEMER'S SECRET TO GROWING RANDY'S BULBS AND SEEDS

David Kraemer is adamant about being patient when it comes to growing species from bulbs or seeds. He tells about some sprouting after awhile, but it really takes from November to March to see the results after leaving the little greenhouses containing them outside all that time. They probably need the cold weather followed by spring conditions to awaken.

David also says that a person must check the protected pots frequently because they should not dry out and they should not be placed in direct sunlight.

He tells about planting the bulbs in a pot and then putting the pot in a plastic bag. Even a ½-gallon milk or water jug that is cut up leaving no cap can be used as a mini greenhouse. If the seeds or bulbs do not emerge after this spring, continue to watch them and leave them out throughout the next winter.
