"IRISES IN ART" THE IRIS SOCIETY OF AUSTIN TO SPONSOR SHOW APRIL 13

The Iris Society of Austin will sponsor an accredited show Saturday, April 13, in the Austin Area Garden Center Auditorium in Zilker Botanical Gardens, 2220 Barton Springs Road, Austin, Texas 78746. Viewing by the public will begin about 1 P.M. for "Irises in Art." Although the flower show will have no admission charges, there is a small fee to visit the gardens.

The members and exhibitors will arrive early to bring their cultivars and exhibits. The Greene Room will have clean vases that are filled with enough water to sustain the freshness of the irises in the horticulture section of the show. Be sure to sign your name on the sheet provided with numbers. Then use your number on all of your entry tags. The show schedule provides the necessary information for classes and sections.

The irises that will be entered should be free of insects,

spiders, and dirt. The stalk and foliage should also be free of fingerprints.

Who is the judge?

Judges' decisions are final. They use their eagle eye to observe the irises especially if one is to be taken to the table of consideration. It is the table holding the irises where judges will make their final decisions concerning the first place pink, blue, yellow, etc. for the display showing the best of the best and runner-up.

What's in a name?

Remember that the cultivar must be named correctly to be judged. It must be cleaned—no spiders or webs, no insects, no pests, no dirt.

Show Hospitality

Those who stay to serve, to work, to keep the public informed by answering questions about irises or the society, as well as to clean when the show is over, may want to purchase their food from the hospitality chair, Nelda Moore, who is having barbecue catered with slaw, beans, potato salad, bread, and dessert. Breakfast will be provided for the judges and some items that will be left will be there for snacks after judging begins. These breakfast items will be juice, coffee, Danish, breads such as cranberry and strawberry, cream cheese spread, and casserole.

What Goes Behind Closed Doors

At the time of this writing a few clerks are still needed so contact Carolyn Wylie soon if you can remain silent while the judges converse. A judge is not to touch the vase or the exhibit or the design, but the clerk will be asked to move the item for a closer look at the flowers by the judge. Perhaps they want to be sure that the design is not holding something like plastic or some thing that is not allowed. The clerk carries a hole punch, pencil or pen, and note pad. She listens to what the clerks say, but this is confidential conservation between judges. She works and assists in the showroom from the beginning to the end of judging when the winning entries are positioned on the queen's table and the ribbons are distributed.

Essentials for Show

Ken Fuchs will bring entry tags, all ribbons, and papers needed for members to complete and judges to sign including their address. You can use address labels from home for your entries.

ENGLISH BOXES

English Boxes are fun to work with since these are a part of Exhibition Judging in the Horticultural Division of the show. This is a collection of single irises without stems, buds, or foliage. The blossoms should be uniform in size, form, substance, and texture. Since they are viewed from above, they should appear to float above the box with no falls touching the surface of the box. These flowers should have the same classification such as all tall bearded or all miniature irises with correctly named cultivars written on a 3 X 5 inch card posted on the outside of the box with the names in the correct position.

Bicolors can be combined with two self colors, but color clash and poor color arrangement will be faulted. Even the background covering should be nonreflective and neutral in color so that it does not clash with the flower color.
