Freemans take the Silver Medal again

Don & Pat Freeman won the AIS Silver Medal Certificate for earning the most blue ribbons with their horticultural entries in the Iris Society of Austin's 2013 Iris Show entitled "Jewels of the Earth." Don and Pat Freeman achieved the highest award in this American Iris Society sanctioned event on the day before Easter by earning twelve blue ribbons in Division I. Stephanie Sheridan won the Bronze Medal Certificate for earning the second highest number of blue ribbons with four.

Don & Pat Freeman also grew the Best Specimen of the Show this year, an iris named 'Different Take,' which was also named, Best Tall-Bearded Iris of the show, and best Texas Hybrid.

The Runner-Up was 'Casino Cruiser,' also entered by the Freemans, which won a Best of Section ribbon for the Space–Age Irises as well.

The Best of Section award for the Historic Irises went to 'Ida Red' shown by Tony & Tiffany Sheridan; this specimen was also named Best Red Iris. The Best of Section award for the Other Irises (this year made up of Dutch and Louisiana Iris) went to 'Miss Saigon' a Dutch Iris shown by Stephanie Sheridan.

It was very interesting this year to have as many Dutch Iris entered as Louisianas, and no Spurias at all. This is no doubt due to the early date of our show. Perhaps our Louisianas and Spurias will be blooming for the Dallas Iris Society's show to be held during National Convention.

Donna Little produced the Best Plicata with 'Hemstitched,' while the Best Bi-Color, 'Coffee Whispers,' was grown by Marney Abel.

Dara Smith won an AIS Special Award Ribbon for the Best Purple named 'Night Moves.' The Best Violet was 'Recurring Dream' grown by Marney Abel.

The Freemans filled out the rest of the Head Table with the following Special Award Ribbon winners:

Yellow flags or *Iris pseudacorus* is used in water purification when it is planted in a substrate or lava-stone in a reedbedsetup so that the roots of the iris can improve water quality by consuming nutrient pollutants from agricultural runoff.
